

- Parade/Fireworks
















Sugar Skulls

Calaveras de azúcar — Sugar Skulls






Papel Picado




Artists use chisels to cut paper and hang them as decorations.












Parade to the cemetery







The Cemetery


The parade leads to gravesites, where families decorate their ancestors graves to honor them.

- Skeletons dressed like the ancestors



Calacas - Skeletons







Skeletons are often shown in everyday activities which depict an ancestor's profession or interests. The **calacas** are often given as toys, or placed on altars in someone's memory.
