Celebrations Mexico Dia De Los Muertos Students will learn about the Mexican Holiday, Day of the Dead, El Dia de los Muertos. It is important for students to learn about other countries to gain exposure and develop appreciation of the various cultures around the world. After creating their own skeleton design, students will transfer their drawing onto styrofoam, and print their art onto colored paper.

Lesson Plan 4 Days

Day 1: Students will learn about Day of the Dead and begin creating their skeleton.

Define: Dia de los Muertos, Symbol EQ: Does a Symbol always mean the same thing to all people? Explain your reasoning.

Day 2: Students will create a Skeleton drawing, then add details. Lastly, they will begin transferring to Styrofoam. <u>Define:</u> Background, foreground review draw along with the PPT. horizon line

Day 3: Students will carefully make a "clean" print of their artwork, and finalize their art with tissue paper along Teacher preps materials for printing. the borders.
