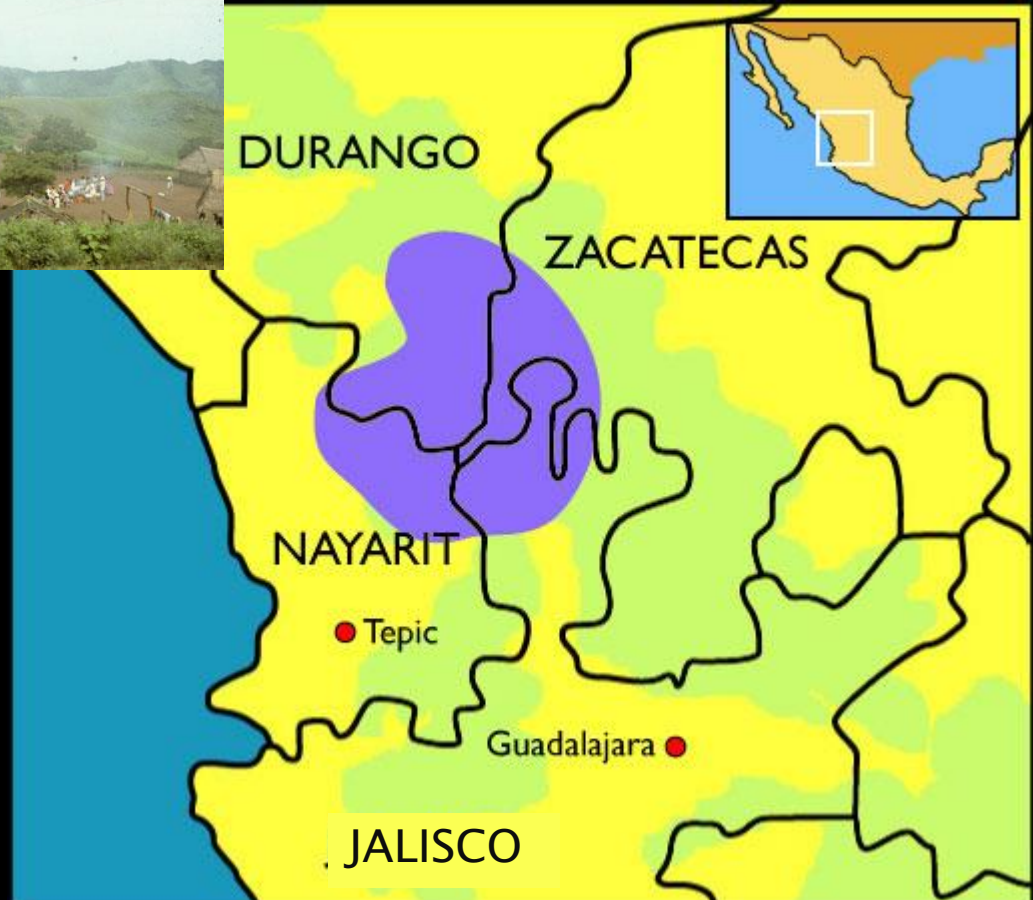
Folk Art

The land is rugged and isolated so the Huichol have kept their traditions.



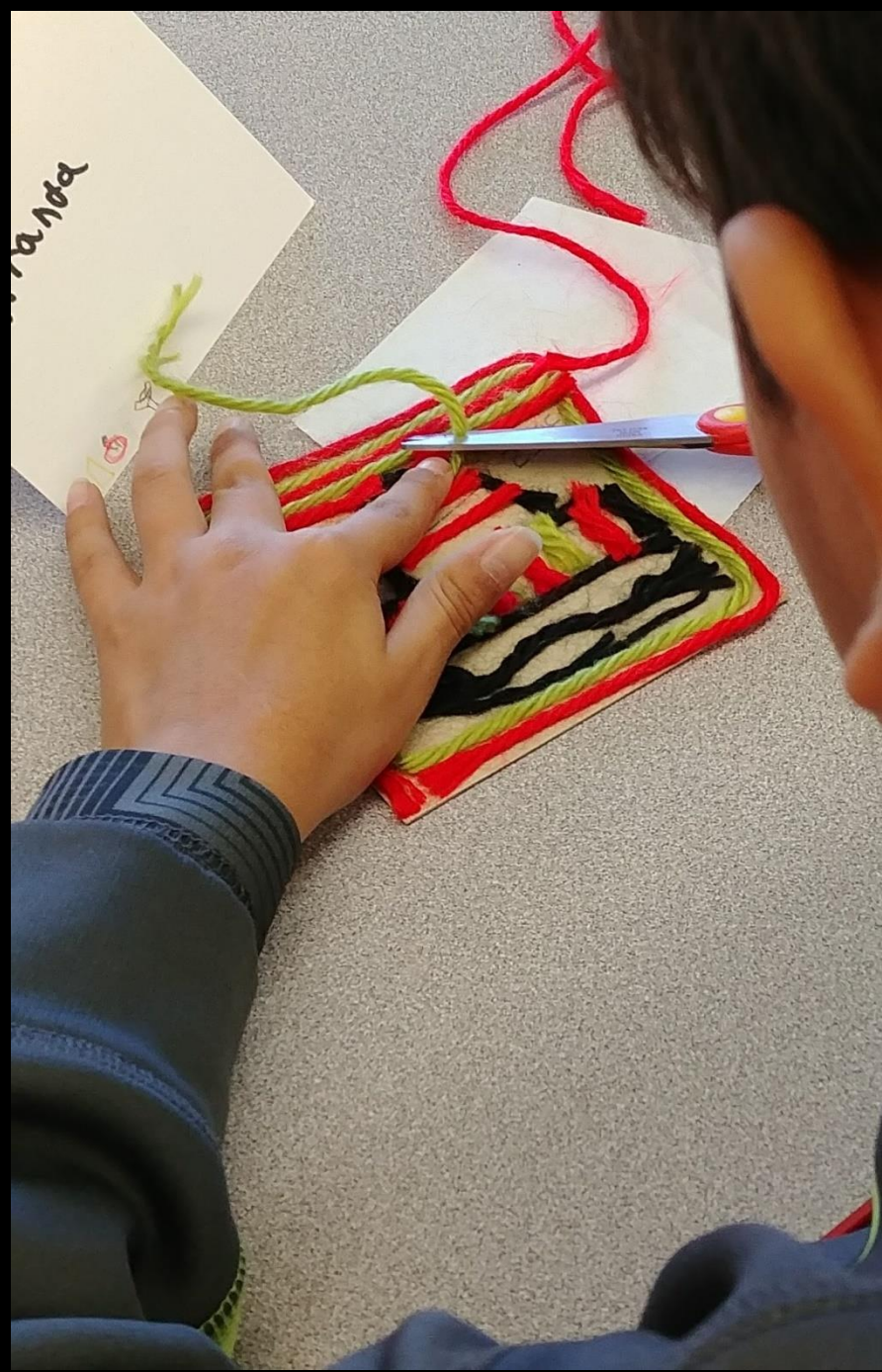
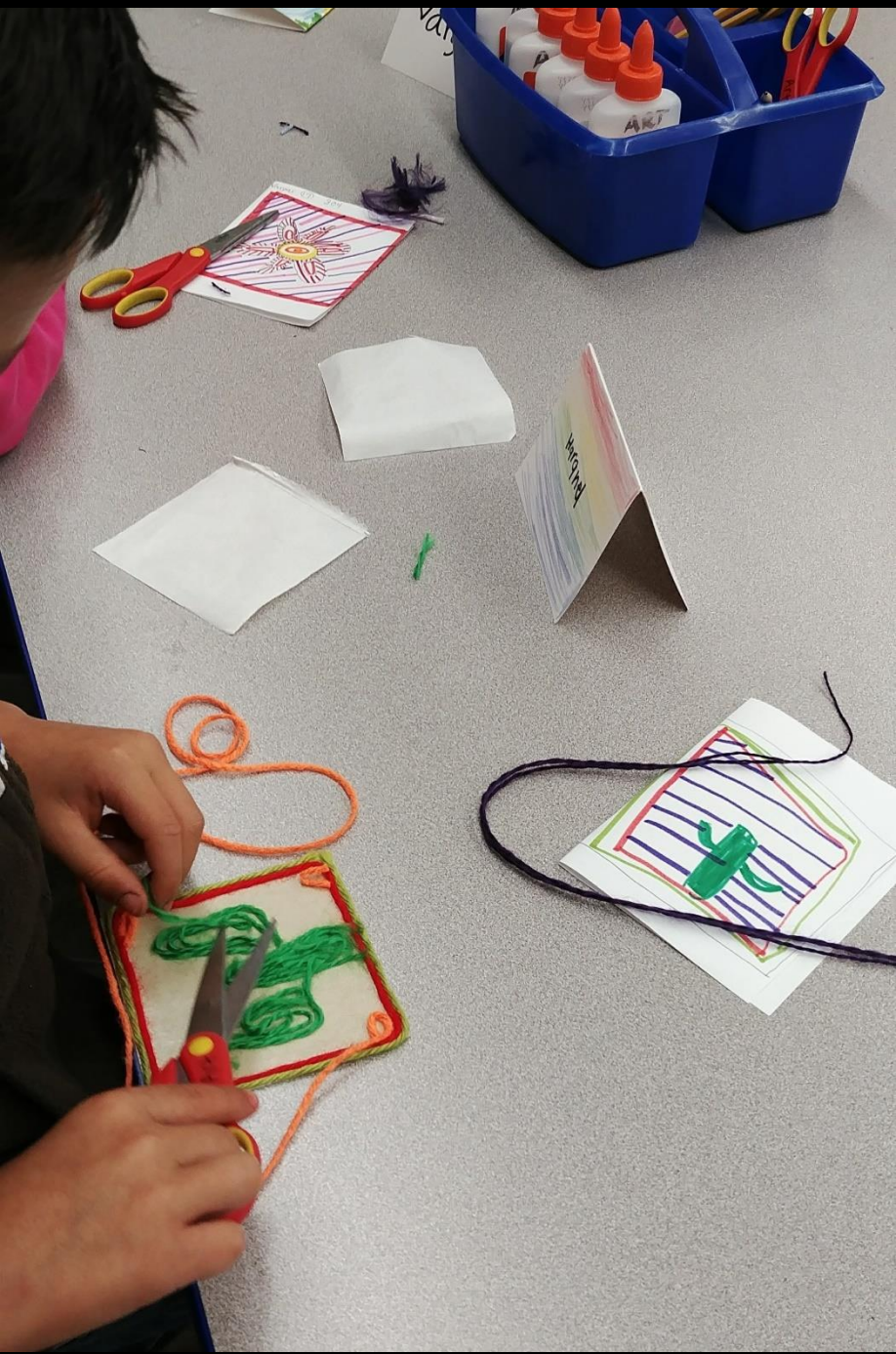
The Huichol make folk art called yarn paintings to tell stories about their culture, history and religion.

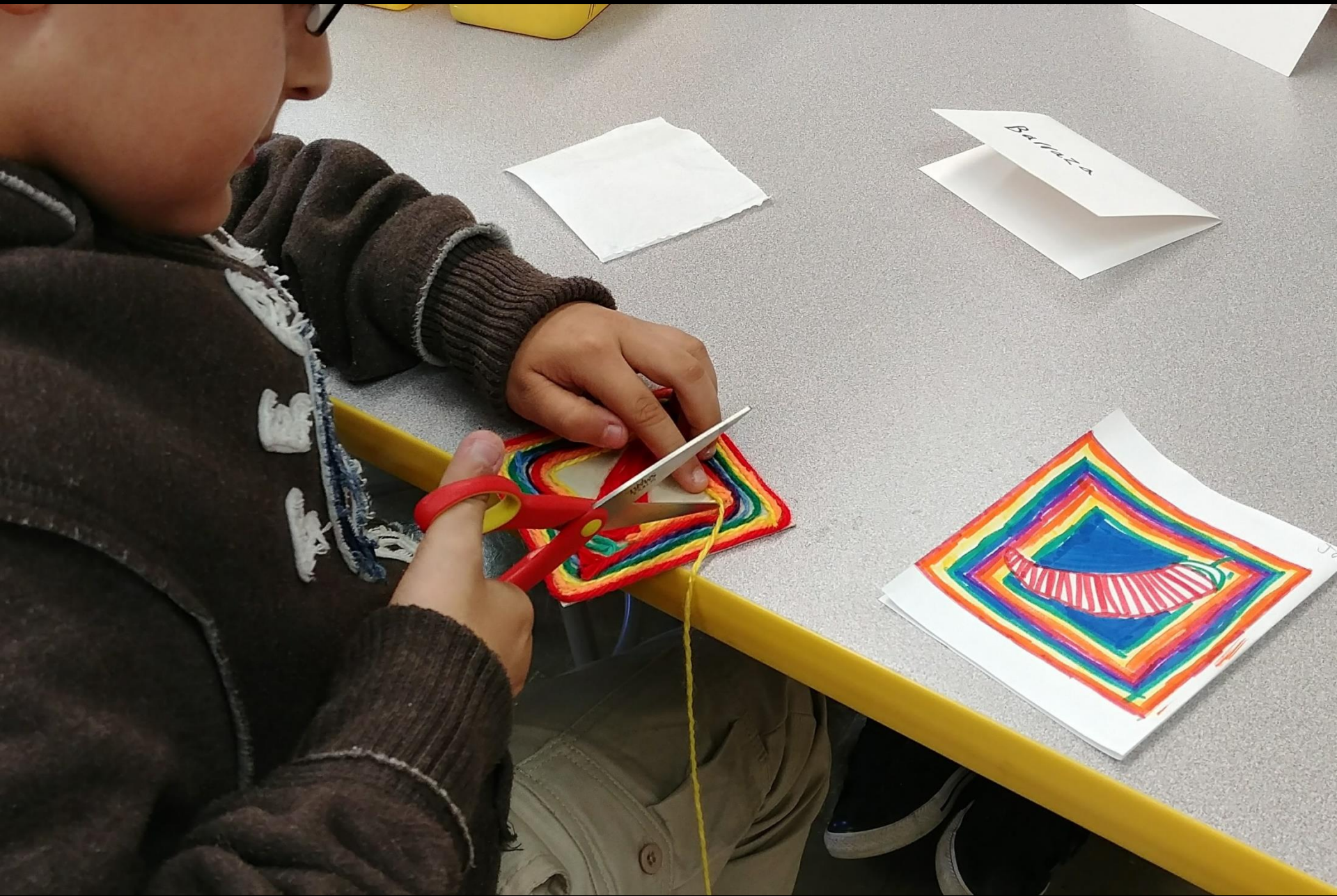
The yarn is pressed into beeswax that has been warmed by the sun.





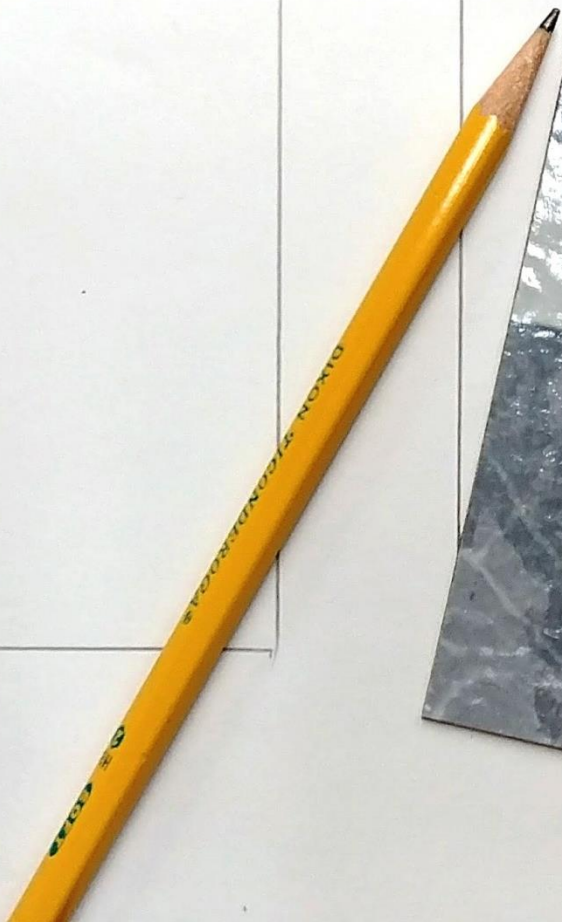
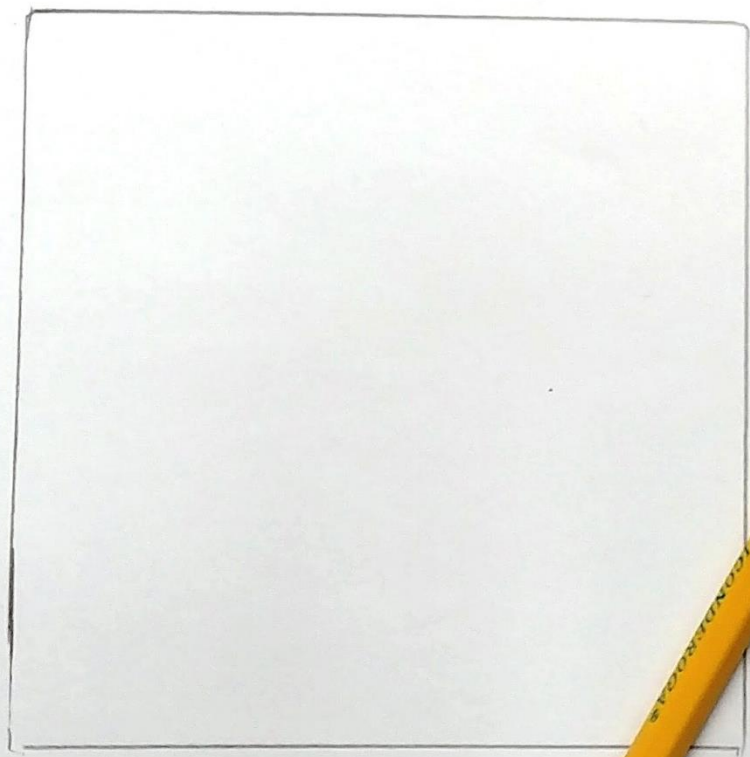




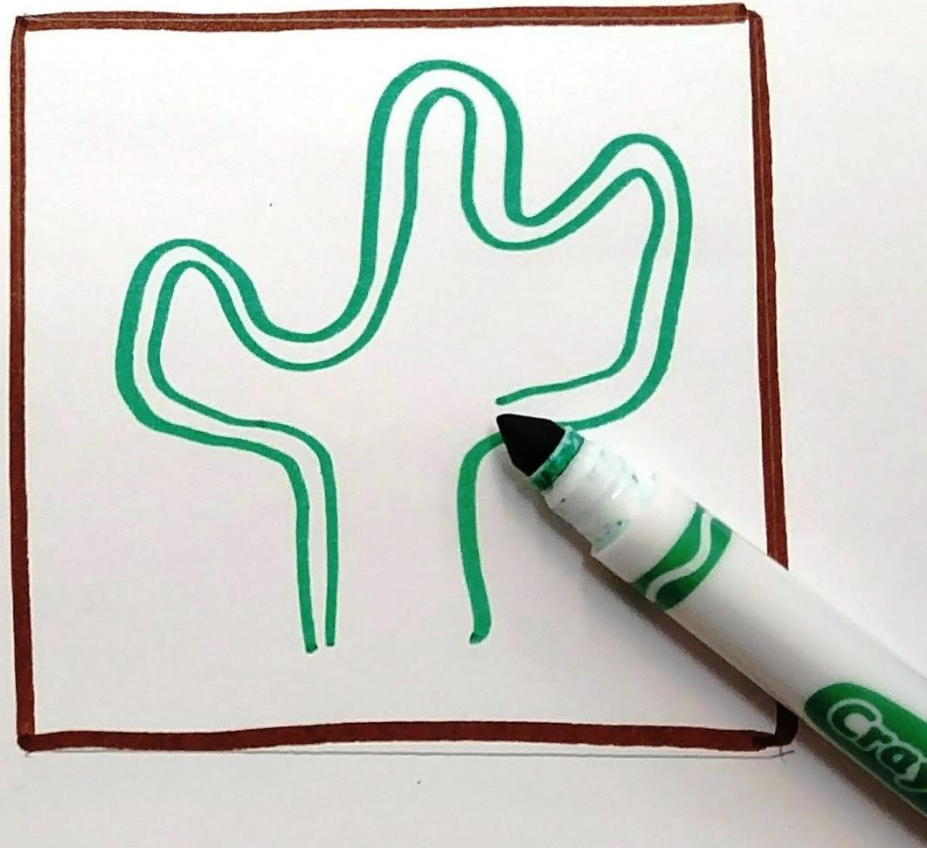




1. trace tile

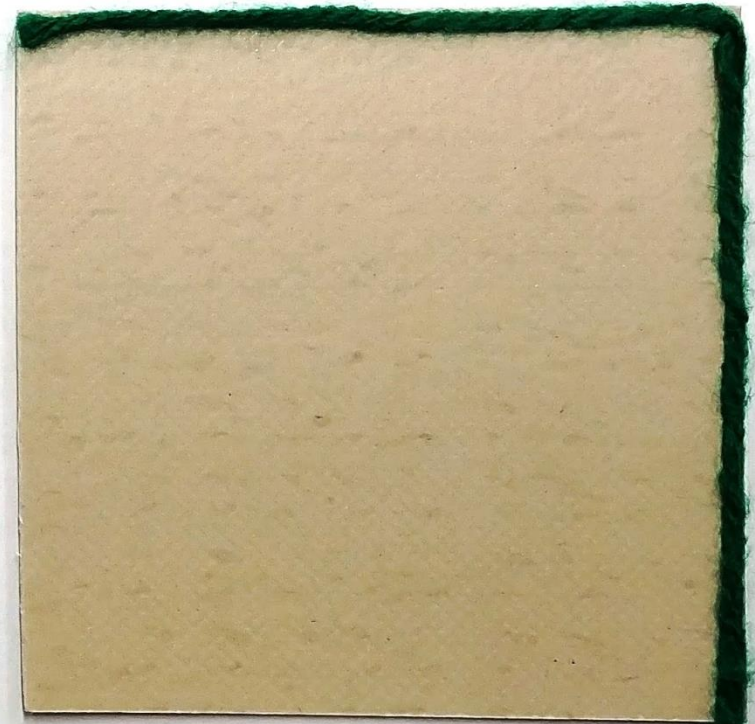

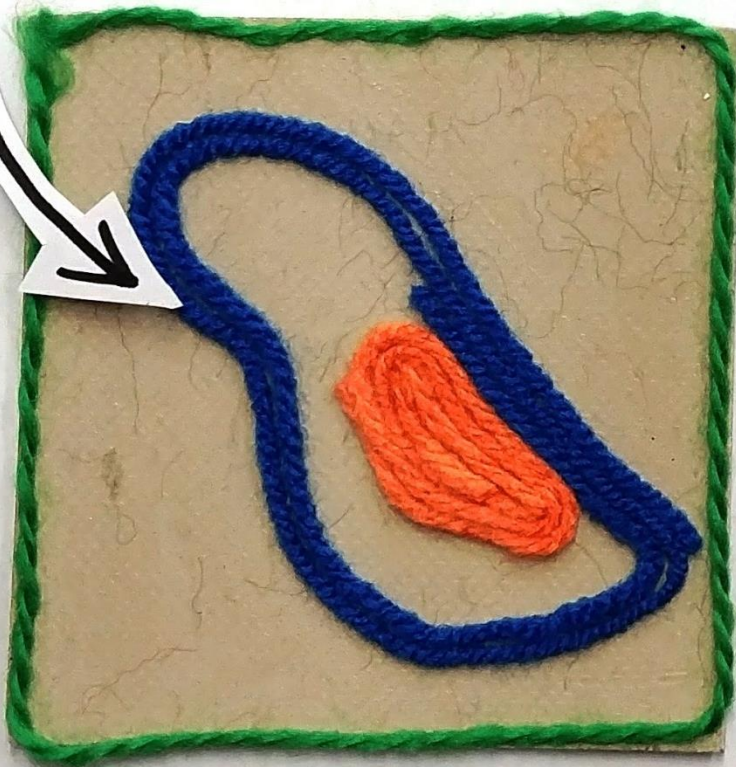
