- Marigolds are the traditional flowers used as decorations.



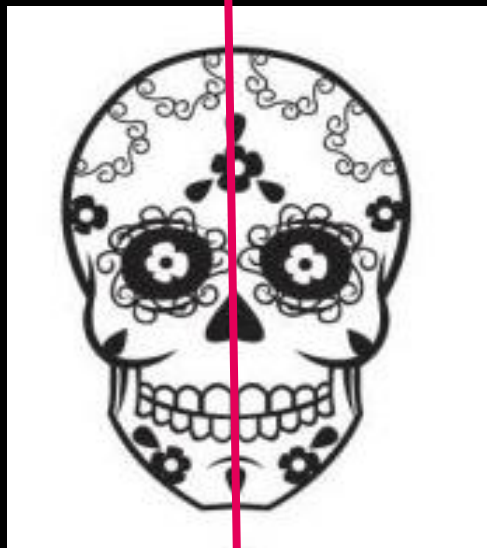
The pleasant sent of the food and flowers is meant to guide the souls home.

Project

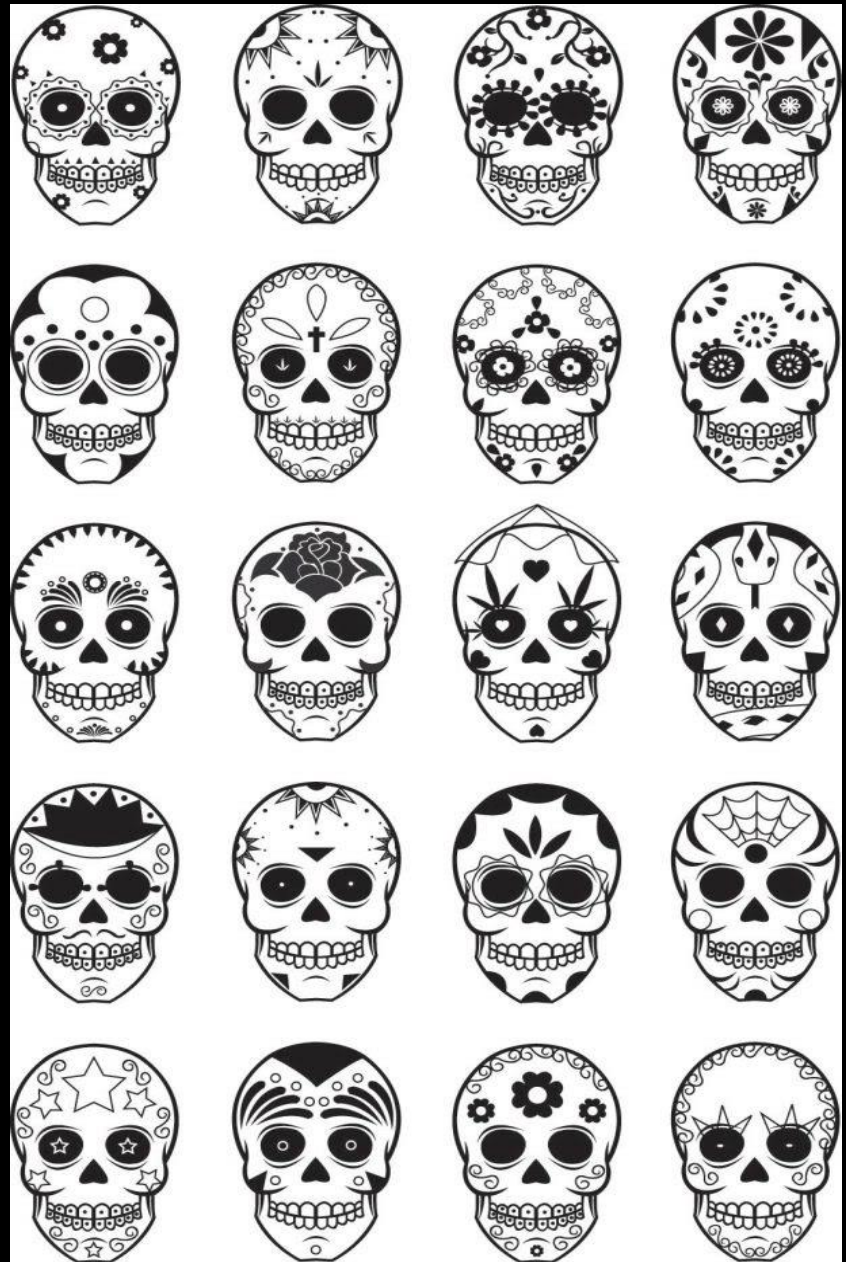
- We will make decorative sugar skulls surrounded by flowers.



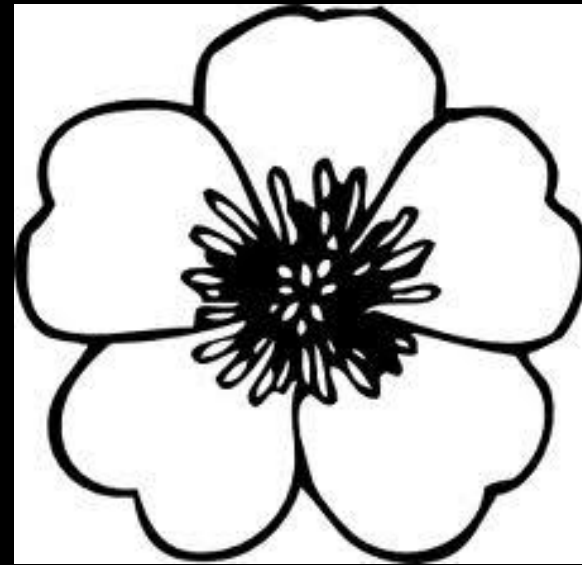
- Our sugar skulls will be symmetrical.
