Lesson Title: Mexican Folk Art Mandela Grade level: 2nd



Content Objectives: Students will be introduced to Mexican Folk Art to celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month. Students will create a circular Mandela by successfully drawing 5 different line patterns, trace them with black marker and color them using bold colored crayons. Students will safely and successfully create a 3-d pattern with tooling foil, cut it out and glue it to the center of the Mandela.

Language Objectives: Students will be able to use the vocabulary line, curvy, zigzag, loopy, castle, straight, bumpy, dotted, Mandela, Mexican Folk Art and bold color.

State Goals: • Identify the element of line (25.A.1d)

- •Use the vocabulary of line when describing a work of art
- Discuss and list expressive characteristics of lines
- •Plan and create a work of art that expresses a specific idea, mood, or emotion using defined elements, principles and tools
- Identify the element of color (25.A.1d)
- •Demonstrate knowledge and skills to create works of visual art using problem solving, observing, designing, sketching and constructing (26.B.2d)

Assessment: Did the student successfully create their own Mandela using 5 different line patterns trace them with a black marker and color in the patterns using bold colored crayons. Did the students safely and successfully create a 3-d pattern on the tooling foil, cut it out and glue it to the center of the Mandela.

Teacher Activities

Student Activities

Day 1

Teacher greets the students and writes Art Jobs on the board. Teacher shows students a presentation and has a discussion while introducing Hispanic Heritage Month and Mexican Folk Art.

Students listen and participate in discussion.

Teacher shows students an example of the lesson,

Teacher provides paper and circle templates and demonstrates drawing the circles and patterns and tracing them with black sharpie.

Students will receive supplies and follow instruction.

Day 2

Teacher demonstrates coloring the patterns and cutting out the Mandela.

Teacher will provide tooling foil and wood sticks and demonstrate how to create patterns inside the tooling foil, cut it out and glue it to the Mandela.

Teacher will lead a critique of the artwork.

Students receive supplies and follow instructions on completing the Mandela.

Students will participate in critique.
